From Our Insurance Agent

Pear Brother Knights and Families,

Health care seems to be a very hot topic. Debates, town hall meetings, newspaper, TV, and radio coverage all have a different approach or opinion. I have been very fortunate with the health care coverage my family has had over the past 30 years. The first 23 years I had no premium payment and a very small co-pay and deductible. The last seven years the co-pay and deductible have increased but not to budget breaking numbers. My first wife's cancer treatments and doctors, surgeons, medicine, and hospital time were all covered without burdening the family. This is unusual and not what we read in the newspapers. There are many families that are destroyed from medical bills and the loss of income when a mother or father is stricken with an illness. Another hot topic is end-of-life counseling. This presents some very negative angles. When a doctor said to me, "Your loved one has 24-48 hours to live, we would like a do not resuscitate order," I was fortunate to have a Catholic priest standing by my side. Very few have had to face this issue; prayer and reflection help. I gave my answer later that night, and the hospital made sure there were witnesses.

Aging parents also present challenges to us. My mother is still in an assisted living facility, paying \$7,000 a month. They have assured us that she can stay when the money runs out. What a deal! My new parents-in-law have unique health issues and live about 2½ hours away from us. Driving is becoming a problem for them and that also means coordinating transportation to doctors, store, church, etc. What do we do with their house and furnishings? Will we be able to find assisted living for under \$7,000 a month in Northern Virginia?

Planning for the future is something we all should be doing, not just retirement or end of life issues. The unknown is hard to explain and guess about. Having adequate life insurance coverage, long-term care coverage and savings all should be considered. The Knights of Columbus offers top of the industry products and services. The Chaplain's Corner

The Triple Colloquy

A colloquy is a conversation. Saint Ignatius introduces The Triple Colloguy to those on retreat during the first week of his Spiritual Exercises as part of the meditations on sin. The period of Advent is a time for preparation for the coming of the Lord on Christmas Day. It is a time to purify ourselves so that we can present ourselves to our Savior. The Triple Colloquy is conversation with Mary, Jesus and God the Father asking them to help us to become aware of areas in our lives that keep us from getting closer to God. A way to prepare ourselves for the Lord's arrival on Christmas day is to say The Triple Colloquy once a day followed by the Sacrament of Reconciliation shortly before Christmas. This is The Triple Colloguy:

- 1. First, I go to Our Lady that she may ask on my behalf for three favors from the Lord:
 - A deep realization of what sin in my life is and a feeling of abhorrence at my own sinful acts.
 - Some understanding and a
 feeling for the disorder
 in my life that is due to
 sin and sinful tendencies,
 that I may begin to know
 how to amend my life
 and bring order into it.

- An insight into the world that stands opposed to Christ, that I may put off from myself all that is worldly and vain.
- Then I say a Hail Mary or a Memorare or some other prayer to Mary.
 - 2. Next, in the company of Mary, I ask the some petitions of her Son, that Jesus may obtain these graces from the Father for me. Then say the Soul of Christ or some other such prayer to Jesus.

Soul of Christ, sanctify me;
Body of Christ, save me;
Blood of Christ, inebriate me;
Water from the side of Christ,
wash me;

Passion of Christ, strengthen me;
O good Jesus, hear me;
Within Thy wounds, hide me;
Permit me not to be separated
from Thee.


The events start at 7 p.m. with Mass, a meal, two talks and opportunity for Confession. They conclude by 9:30 p.m.
