- **Startup Programs.** Grants to establish new and innovative programs designed to assist individuals with intellectual disabilities and their families.
- **Special Olympics.** KOVAR is a sponsor of the Virginia Special Olympics, donating over \$25,000 each year.

The Chaplain's Corner

A PRAYER TO EMPLORE THE GRACE OF DEVOTION

Written by Thomas a' Kempis

Thomas of Kempis was born at the Lower Rhine region in Kempen, County of Cleves, Germany, in 1380. He became a monk in the Order of Saint Augustine, and for 66 years until he died he lived a virtuous life in the monastery of Zwoll.

Over the years his reputation for piety and virtue spread far and wide. He was sought out for spiritual direction and for his edifying and pious counsel. He was not very tall. He had a well proportioned body, and was said to have a piercing eye. Thomas of Kempis died at the age of 90 in 1471.

He wrote the *Imitation of Christ* primarily for those in religious orders, but its contents are also helpful for laity seeking to get closer to God and are valid for us today. The book talks about imitating Christ in all things, having a humble opinion of oneself, prudence in what we do, resisting temptation, avoiding rash judgment, bearing the defects of others, the interior life, being at peace with oneself, the joy of a good conscience, gratitude for God's graces, listening to God without the noise of words, the wonderful effects of divine love, patience with carnal desires, supporting injuries with patience, four things which bring much peace, obtaining freedom of heart, desire of eternal life, imitating Christ on the cross, the love


of God, exercises before
Holy Communion, the
desire to receive Christ,
and other topics that will help us to become
imitations of Christ.

The following is a prayer written by Thomas of Kempis that can be said to be asking God for a deeper devotion to Him:

God bless you all, Father James S. Barkett

0 Lord my God, You are all my good; and who am I, that I should presume to speak to You? I am Your least, Your poorest servant, and a pitiable little worm, poorer far and more contemptible than I know or dare express. Yet know, 0 Lord, that I am nothing, I have nothing, and can do nothing. You alone are good, just, and holy; You can do all things; You give all things; You fill all things, leaving only the sinner empty and fruitless.

Remember Your mercies and fill my heart with Your grace, You Who rule that Your works should not be in vain. How can I bear myself in this comfortless life, unless You give me strength by Your mercy and grace? Do not turn Your face from me, delay not Your visitation, withdraw not Your comfort; lest to You my soul becomes as earth without water. 0 Lord, teach me to do Your will, teach me to walk worthily and humbly before You; for You are my wisdom, Who knows me in truth, and Who knew me before the world was made, and before I was born in the world.

Process for Sainthood

Father Michael J. McGivney was given the title "Venerable Servant of God" by the Holy See in March 2008. The bestowal of the title "Venerable" on Father McGivney marks another important step on the journey to beatification and canonization. It signals that the Congregation for the Causes of Saints has carefully considered the positio on Father McGivney's life and virtue, and after consulting with historical experts and theologians, has judged it to be valid and convincing.

Once the members of the congregation made a positive judgment on the positio, the matter was referred to the Holy Father for his approval. His positive response made possible the issuance of a "decree of heroic virtue" and the bestowal of the title "Venerable"

What comes next?

The pasitio on the reported miracle has been submitted to the Holy See and is currently under consideration. Medical and theological experts must carefully examine the evidence in order to pass judgment on the case. If judged positively by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, that judgment will be passed to Pope Benedict XVI, who alone makes the decision about bentifications and canonizations.



The technical aspects of a cause for canonization are fascinating but can sometimes distract us from the essential focus; the glory of God made manifest in the holiness of one of his servants. Father McGivney's cause, in particular, is a summons to ordinary Catholics to embrace the mystery of Christ in it's fullness so each of us will see where we are called to heroic virtue. Father McGivney was an apostle of lay spirituality, and his message is intensified each time the Church recognizes his outstanding life and virtue.

Please consider the following prayer intentions left on the McGivney Guild wehpage:

Gresham, OR—Please pray for my wife Gloria who has been buttling cancer for 6 years. She is only 51 and losing hope.

Laurel, Md—Fr. McGivney, I ask your intercession for my brother who is suffering terribly from leukemia. He has 4 children. The doctors have recommended he discontinue treatment. Dundee, MI—That my husband, Allen, in applying for a job, will obtain one that will support our family to financial freedom so that we will be able to visit our children and grandchildren regularly.
